

WCCC Placement Test Information

- The Accuplacer placement test is given to new students to determine their present skills in reading comprehension, sentence structure, math, and computer skills.
- On test day, there will be an orientation to Accuplacer, the test is given, then advising staff will explain test results and schedule classes. The entire Placement Test and Educational Planning process will take approximately three hours.
- Students with an associate's or bachelor's degree are exempt from taking the test. Details on exemptions can be found in the "Placement Testing" under "Admissions and Aid" on the college web site- www.wccc.edu or call 724-925-6893. Allied Health programs require placement testing for all students.
- If you have earned credits in the past 10 years from a regionally accredited college, contact Admissions, 724-925-4077, for evaluation and acceptance of credits. This process should be started at least 2 weeks prior to scheduling for the placement test.

STEPS TO TAKE:

- Apply to WCCC:**
 - **Submit** a WCCC Application for Admission. Can be done on-line, mailed or delivered in-person. (Online applications take 48 hours to be processed; mailed applications-allow for mail delivery time & processing; in-person applications require up to one hour to be processed.)
 - **High school students who are interested in the early high school enrichment program, must instead submit a High School Early Enrollment Form and return it by two weeks before the test.** Obtain Early Enrollment form from your high school guidance counselor or WCCC Admissions office.
- Schedule the date, time and location to take the test.** The test is given year round.
 - **Call** either the main campus in Youngwood, 724-925-6893, or the individual education center to schedule the placement test.
 - **Review** placement test information at www.wccc.edu. Click on "Admissions & Aid", then "Placement Testing" for test info, sample questions, free test preparation resources & frequently asked questions. If you do not have internet access and would like to request a booklet of sample test questions, please call 724-925-6893, go to Founders Hall, Room 555, or your local education center.
 - Students who have a documented disability and require accommodations for testing, contact Mary Ellen Beres at 724-925-4189.
 - Early enrollment high school students, contact Admissions at 724-925-4051.
- Obtain your WCCC Student ID Card.**
 - You may arrive about 15-30 minutes early to obtain your WCCC Student Photo ID card in Student Services- Founders Hall, Room 130. (Students testing at an education center may get their student ID there.)
 - **Please present a current issued photo ID card such as driver's license, state non-driver's license photo ID, high school photo ID, other college photo ID, passport, etc.**
- On test day - Report to Founders Hall, Room 555 & bring the following:**
 - Your WCCC Student ID Card
 - 2 pencils
 - No calculators are permitted; paper for calculations is provided.
 - Any transcripts you may have from other colleges you attended
 - Optional- Completed financial aid forms
 - Optional- Information on the college & major you plan to transfer to
